CONSIGNOR'S REMINDERS

CHECK-IN SCHEDULE

- Horses must arrive at Canterbury Park on Friday, August 6th, between 9:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. **YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED ACCESS TO THE RECEIVING BARN FOR UNLOADING AFTER 1:00 P.M. ON FRIDAY, August 6th.**
- Please move your horses and supplies in as quickly as possible and move your truck/trailer to the Horsemen's Lot so that we can avoid having the yearlings wait on the trailers for too long.

PARKING

- All trailers must be parked in the Horsemen's Lot. There are to be no trailers parked in Shire Square or on the Backside.

STALLING

- Stalls will be available for cleaning beginning at noon on Wednesday, August 4th. Two bales of straw will be outside each stall on Thursday morning.
- ALL HORSES MUST BE IN THEIR STALLS BY 1:00 p.m. on Friday, August 6th.**
- Horses will be stalled in the Receiving Barn. Maps will be posted indicating the location of each Consignor and stall cards will be in place prior to your arrival.

TEST BARN OFF LIMITS!

- The Test Barn and restrooms located in the Receiving Barn near the Test Barn are **COMPLETELY OFF LIMITS TO EVERYONE! ABSOLUTELY NO EXCEPTIONS!!!** Do not enter the Test Barn area for any reason! Do not park your vehicle in the Test Barn lot or near any of the doors. Do not use the hoses or hydrants in the Test Barn, other hydrants are available for your use. The MRC has been assured that steps are being taken to insure biosecurity during this sale.

RESTROOMS

- Restrooms will be available in Shire Square, just to the south of the Receiving Barn as you are walking to the Grandstand.

IDENTIFICATION

- Identification and hip tagging of each horse will begin at 9:00 a.m. Saturday, August 7th. Your yearlings need to have been bathed and dry prior to being tagged. **Any horse not identified and tagged while the Identifier is present will not be allowed in the sales ring.**

STABLE GATE

- To enter Canterbury Park you will be required to show a **current Health Certificate dated within 10 days of the sale date and a Coggins Certificate dated within six months of the sale.** These will be required for each horse consigned and must be in your possession or you will not be allowed on the grounds. These documents are to be turned in to the MTA Office immediately upon your arrival.

IMPORTANT HEALTH NOTICES

●**Communicable and Infectious diseases:**

Horses known by the Exhibitor to have an infectious, communicable disease or known to have been exposed to an infectious, communicable disease may not be entered in the Sale. **Warts and Ringworm are considered communicable diseases.** A statement from a Veterinarian that a horse is being treated for these diseases is not acceptable. All horses will be inspected by the Sale Veterinarian the day of the sale. The Sale Veterinarian may order immediate removal from the premises any horse with symptoms of any infectious or communicable disease.

●**Vaccinations:**

Horses brought to the sale must be current on vaccinations for Tetanus, Influenza, Rhino and Eastern and Western Encephalomyelitis. Vaccinations for West Nile Virus and Strangles are strongly recommended. Vaccinations and dates should be included on the Health Certificate.

MTA PAPERWORK REQUIREMENTS

- COPIES** of the following must be received by the MTA Office no later than Wednesday, August 4th. Documents may be faxed to (952) 496-3672.

Health Certificate – dated within 10 days of sale (on or after July 29, 2010)
Coggins Certificate – dated within six months of the sale (on or after February 7, 2010)

●**ORIGINALS** must be filed with the MTA Office immediately upon arrival at Canterbury Park and no later than 5:00 p.m. on Friday, August 6th:

CORRECTIONS/ADDITIONS TO CATALOG PAGE

●All corrections/additions to the catalog page are due, in writing, in the office NO less than 72 hours prior to the sale.

Horses with incomplete paperwork will not be sold!

RESERVES

●**ALL RESERVES MUST BE REGISTERED, IN WRITING, WITH THE MTA OFFICE by NOON on SATURDAY, August 7th.**

PARADE OF YEARLINGS

●The Parade of Yearlings will be held at 4:30 p.m. on Friday, August 6th in the Walking Ring. All yearlings are required to participate in this event.

SALE will be held following the afternoon races! With the large number of horses consigned we ask that you be prepared well in advance so that we can move through the sale at a pace that will hold the crowd's interest.

You are responsible for providing personnel to groom your horse and bring it to and from the Parade of Yearlings and the Sales Ring. Barn Managers will inform you when it is time to take the horse to the Walking Ring for the Parade of Yearlings at 4:30 p.m. on August 6th and the Sales Ring during the evening auction. You will be responsible for presenting your yearling during the Parade of Yearlings. A Handler will present the yearling in the Sales Ring.

Following the sale it is the Consignors' responsibility to pick up all papers for horses that did not sell from the MTA payment table which will be located near the sales ring. The individual retrieving these important papers will be asked to sign a form acknowledging that he/she has received them. These papers will include a Release Form, which will be required by the Stable Gate before a horse can be removed from the grounds. Jockey Club Papers will be held until any commission due is paid in full.

ALL YEARLINGS MUST BE SHOWN USING A CHIFNEY BIT OR LIP SHANK! NO EXCEPTIONS! Horses not properly outfitted will not be allowed in the Parade of Yearlings or Yearling Sale. This is for the safety of all involved! If you need help in locating a Chifney Bit, please contact the MTA Office at 952-496-3770.

LEATHER SALE HALTERS REQUIRED

The MTA will provide all yearlings consigned to the 2010 Yearling Sale with a leather sale halter with a name plate. The halters will be distributed upon arrival and must remain with the yearling when sold. If a yearling does not have its sale halter on when the new owner arrives to take the horse, the price of the halter will be deducted from the proceeds. In the event that a yearling is scratched from the sale, the halter will be given to the owner.

HOSPITALITY TABLES/MARKETING/SALES – there is to be no marketing of any products, services, or business during the Yearling Sale.

The MTA will provide the first bedding (2 bales of straw per horse)

You are responsible for providing:

Additional bedding

Water buckets – please bring a bucket that can be left with the horse after the sale to insure that the horse has access to water until picked up by the new owner.

Feed tubs

Grain and Hay

Fans and all necessary extension cords, power strips, etc.

All care necessary to insure the health, comfort and safety of your horses.

PAYMENT

●Checks for all horses will be held for 30 days following the sale.
